Biographical Note:

Philadelphians Herman and Lena Hurlong began spending summers in Arden around 1914, when their son Edmond was just an infant. In 1939, Edmond Hurlong met and married Maria "Bunni" Bundrock, who was studying sculpture in Arden with Marcus Aurelius Renzetti. Bundrock was born in Pennsylvania in 1916 and studied painting, illustration, and sculpture at the University of the Arts in Philadelphia. Following their marriage, Edmond and Bunni Hurlong made Arden their permanent home, although they continued to travel abroad frequently. Edmond Hurlong set up Arden Exports,

where he manufactured and shipped dental supplies internationally. Bunni Hurlong taught sculpture, and exhibited her work at the Corcoran Gallery, Breck's Mill, and Delaware Art Center. Both Edmond and Bunni were extensively involved in local theater, and were members of the Arden Players Gild. They had four daughters: Sandra, Lisa, Julie, and Raquel. Sandra Hurlong earned her doctorate in anthropology and is now President of the Intercultural Open University Foundation. Lisa Hurlong, who trained with Andres Segovia, is a professional classical guitarist based in Spain.

Edmond Hurlong passed away in 2001. Bunni Hurlong lived to be 97 years old, passing away on September 17, 2013.

Scope and Content:

The Hurlong Family Collection includes of materials about Bunni and Lisa Hurlong as well as members of the Stephens and Ware families. The collection also contains ephemera about the Arden Building and Loan Association, theatrical productions, art exhibits, the Arden Club, and ACRA.

The Hurlong Family Collection contains a small amount of material explicitly related to members of the Hurlong family, including advertisements for Lisa Hurlong's classical guitar performances, newspaper clippings about Bunni Hurlong's sculpture and travels, and Bunni Hurlong's resume. The collection also features materials related to the Stephens and Ware families, who were prominent in the Ardens' early history. These items include correspondence to and from Frank Stephens, a letter from Hamilton "Buzz" Ware, a letter from Arden weaver Maude Rhodes to furniture maker Don Stephens, and obituaries for Frank and Eleanor Stephens. Finally, there are several items regarding the art collection of Ardenites Peg and Lew Aumack.

The collection also includes materials on several local institutions, including serial share accounts from the Arden Building and Loan Association, annual reports for the Arden School district, commencement programs for other local schools, and advertisements for exhibits at Arden's Warehouse Gallery. The Hurlongs also collected community newsletters and materials from ACRA and the Arden Club.

The Hurlongs' interest in theater is evident in their collection of ephemera from Ardensingers, the Moonlight Theatre, and the Arden Players Gild.
